Dr Jane Goodall is a world-renowned British primatologist, ethologist, anthropologist, and United Nations Messenger of Peace. Her extensive research into the behaviour of chimpanzees, which started in Tanzania in the 1960s and continues today, fundamentally altered scientific thinking about the relationship between humans and other mammals.

In 1977. Dr Goodall established the Jane Goodall Institute, which continues her research and is a global leader in the effort to protect chimpanzees and their habitats. The Institute is recognised for its innovative, community-centred conservation and development programmes. Dr Goodall's Roots & Shoots, an environmental and humanitarian youth programme, connects thousands of youth globally who strive to make the world a better place for all living things.

Her honours include the French Legion of Honour, the Medal of Tanzania, and Japan's prestigious Kyoto Prize. In 2002, Dr Goodall was appointed as a UN Messenger of Peace and in 2004 was named a Dame of the British Empire.
